Repair, Restoration and Reparation

In a widely circulated talk, Nobel Laureate, Toni Morrison is asked by an audience member: "how [do you] survive whole in a world where [we] are all victims of something?" Morrison responds, "sometimes you don't survive whole, you survive in part". Morrison reminds us of the tough work of repair after events or incidents that threaten to splinter our minds, bodies and souls. In this call for a variety of contributions for the 2024 Anthropology Southern Africa conference we invite anthropological explorations and considerations of *repair*.

Wars, conflict and the climate crisis among others continue to litter contemporary worlds with many forms of trauma at every level of social, cultural and interpersonal life. In his recent book, "The Work of Repair: Capacity after Colonialism in the Timber Plantations of South Africa", Thomas Cousins explores repair in the timber plantations of Kwa-Zulu Natal in South Africa. Drawing on Kader Attia's notion of repair, Cousins explores the efforts of interlocutors in the study to enhance their lives and capacities despite the injuries of the past and contemporary South African life. Similarly, Naadira Patel in "The work of making things work: A review of *Practices of Repair*", asks: "What does a practice of repair look like in a system that privileges waste and discard as regular practice?"

For the 2024 conference, we invite anthropological and ethnographically grounded explorations of repair, restoration and reparation. We invite contributions that explore, but are not limited to, considerations of:

- The work of repair, restoration and/or reparation
- Survival and flourishing in a "post"-catastrophic world
- Repairing capitalism
- The political economy of repair
- Beauty and creativity in challenging contexts
- Repairing that which one can't quite see, hear, touch, feel, smell
- Possibility in the midst of never ending challenge(s)
- Repairing anthropology
- Repairing bodies, cities and environments
- Restoring dignity from the damages of racial, gender and sexual oppression
